<u>EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S UPDATE – Cindy Barbera-Brelle</u> Assistant Director – Operations Position Recruitment

Executive Director Barbera-Brelle stated that interviews are scheduled for May 11th and 13th. Four members of the Executive Committee (Chiefs Clark, Lamkin, Malcolm and Scanlan) and Mr. Bragg and Mr. Rummel are on the interview panel.

Cindy is also asking for 3 representatives from the Executive Committee to serve as assessors for the Assessment Center scheduled for May 12th.

Mult-IP Mobile Connectivity Project

NWCDS is in the process of updating its Radio IP's Mult-IP network management software to support 64 bit laptops and this will ultimately include access to the new Comcast public internet. A maintenance window to move to the Comcast public internet is scheduled for Tuesday. Both the current WOW internet and the Comcast internet will be running in tandem until Friday, March 27th after which the WOW internet will be canceled.

Comcast Network Connectivity Project

The 10MB Opt-E-Man line that runs between the Center and the Schaumburg backup was transitioned to a 20MB Comcast ENS link on March 17th. We are migrating communities off of the AT&T Sonet and to the Comcast EVL Network at a rate of 3 sites per month. Completion expected at the end of June.

9-1-1 Services Advisory Board

The 9-1-1 Services Advisory Board continues to meet and Executive Director Barbera-Brelle hopes to have a report by April 1st. Workshops and Advisory Board Meetings have been scheduled during March. The next Board meeting is scheduled for 3/26. The following items have been discussed:

- •9-1-1 Advisory Board Transitioning to a Governing Board
- Authority to Force Consolidation.
- •Having the Same Wireline/Wireless Surcharge Rate of \$0.79 for ETSB's
- •State to pay 9-1-1 Network Costs
- •All 9-1-1 Systems will be Held Harmless on their Wireline Surcharge
- Remaining Funds estimated to be \$46.7 million will be distributed based on a Formula
- RFI/RFP State Wide NG9-1-1 System (5 year Deployment Timeline)
- •Give more thought to the elimination of ETSB's

NEW BUSINESS

8.A. <u>CAD System Consultant</u>

Proposals to evaluate our current CAD System were requested from L.R. Kimball, Mission Critical Partners and Federal Engineering, Inc. The Executive Director requested deferring this to the next meeting so that she can consult with staff and report back to the Board at the May meeting.

8.B. Collective Bargaining Agreement

A meeting is scheduled for March 23rd with attorneys and both bargaining teams. Further discussion is deferred until the May meeting.

8.C. <u>Venture Agreement</u>

Attorney Zimmerman reviewed the NWCDS Venture Agreement and Bylaws while researching the question of whether NWCDS could offer a subscription service. He advised that the NWCDS Venture Agreement has a narrow purpose 'emergency communications'. The Venture Agreement would need to be modified to include the ability to offer cost sharing services. He drafted an updated Venture Agreement for the Board to consider.

Moved by Mr. Rummel and seconded by Mr. Bragg to approve the Venture Agreement to go forth to the municipalities for a vote and subject to requiring a three-fourths approval of new members. Mr. Zimmerman also advised that there was one other change and that is that the Bylaws shall bind a member as if they have a contract. *Voice Vote: Motion Carried*.

8.D. Executive Director's Compensation

Moved by Mr. Otteson and seconded by Mr. Rummel to allow the Chairman and Chairman-Elect to implement what was discussed in closed session with regard to the Executive Director's Compensation. *Voice Vote: Motion Carried.*

8.E. Nomination/Election of Officers - 2015

Moved by Mr. Rummel, seconded by Mr. Ottesen to recommend the Buffalo Grove Village Manager Mr. Bragg to be Chairman and the Schaumburg Village Manager Mr. Townsend to be Vice-Chairman, for a term of twelve (12) months. *Voice Vote: Motion Carried*.

Executive Director Barbera-Brelle reminded everyone that National Telecommunicator Week is the week of April 12-18.

Mr. Ottesen asked for more information regarding cell phones to 9-1-1 and how accurate the locations are with regard to cell phone. Cindy stated that she will get him additional information.

Chief Clark announced that Streamwood Village Manager Gary O'Rourke will be retiring this May. He will be at the May meeting and will be bringing Acting Manager Sharon Caddigan.
